COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

Christmas Work-Shop Building:

Morrison Street Water Filtration Plant:

Purchase of the Bunge property has been completed. Waiting on copies of the recorded deed and easement.

Pre-Closing of the SRF loan took place on November 26 at Barnes and Thornburg. No problems at this time for the final close on December 10.

Umbaugh representative presented a letter stating the saving of getting the SRF loan was close to a million dollars in interest. It also out lined the payment schedule for the loan and the required monthly transfer of money to the various payment reserve accounts.
